COST: Free app. Charge for certain features.

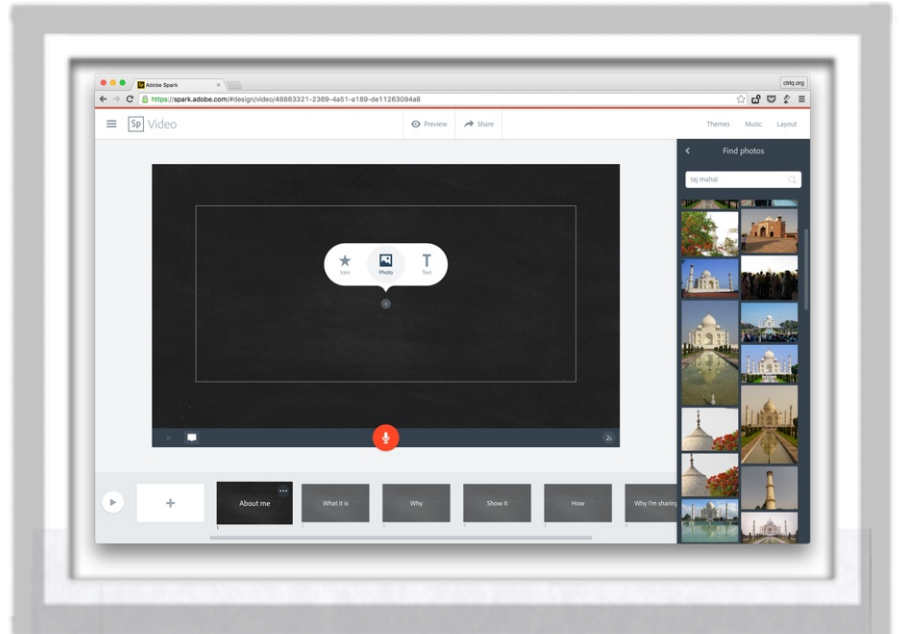
Accounts: Use your Google Account, you will have to enter your birthdate. Make sure to uncheck the box for receiving marketing messages from Adobe

Differentiation: Teachers and staff can make videos for differentiated instruction

Reporting: Exports directly to camera roll, creates a link online and gives an embed code

Ads and Inappropriate Content: There is a built-in photo search that can lead to inappropriate photos, must be monitored if using with students.

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SUMMARY:

Adobe Spark Video, formerly Adobe Voice, is a simplified video editing tool that can include pictures, up to 30 seconds of video, narration and a soundtrack. You can trim clips easily and add several themes. Videos are posted online and can be saved to the camera roll. You will need to use your Google Account to log into the app and it asks for your birthdate.
